Where: Just off the A41 between Aylesbury and Hemel Hempstead, nestled inside the Chilterns Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

Home to: A lime avenue, aging oak, ash and beech trees, and red kites. There are also rare purple emperor butterflies, common spotted orchids, and other chalk grassland species.
